BERYL AND ITS IMPACTS

Hurricane Beryl, a powerful tropical cyclone that occurred in the Caribbean region. Beryl made a significant impact in the Caribbean region with winds ranging from 140 to 160 mph, Beryl became the first hurricane of the 2024 Atlantic season. Notably, it achieved the strongest possible ranking of Category 5, marking the earliest storm on record to reach this intensity in Jamaica.
